Director's Message

While you may have seen our recent grant announcement on Facebook or the newspapers, I'm delighted to give you the details of what you, our patrons, will be getting with our \$10,000 humanities grant. In a nutshell, it's more programs for you in the spring, summer and fall!

This spring RPL will be using a V-brick scanner to digitize a large number of church ledgers and minute books--some as early as the 1840s. Once digitized, books will be uploaded to the Indiana Memory database where everyone can access these materials. While we're in the scanning process we're allowing groups to come in, watch the scanning and uploading process and ask questions. This is the same thing Google Books does, only now it's at your library!

This summer, we'll be offering a 6-week hands on Hispanic cooking class at RCHS that will be lead by our Hispanic community members. This class comes with a cookbook that students will read, use and discuss throughout the 6 weeks. It all culminates at a "catered" community pool party in July.

In the fall, participants in our ABC book club will received copies of "Sketches of Rush County". Instead of meeting to discuss the book, we'll be traveling in and around the county to get a first hand view of all the places, events and people we'll read about. Finally, RPL will purchase a subscription to NoveList, a database that helps readers find their next perfect book. Keep watching our newsletters, FB feed and the newspapers to find out more about all these exciting activities coming in the next 7-8 months!
