

## Director's Message

There is SO MUCH going on at RPL in the May and June months. Summer reading begins Monday, May 23rd and is open to all library card holders. Infants, toddlers, kids, teens and adults are all invited to our "Oceans of Discovery" program. (If I've forgotten an age group just know you're invited too!) Our calendar is jam packed with activities that has something for everyone. Here's just a taste of what you can discover this summer through RPL: live sharks, pool and foam parties, story times, crafts for teens and kids, Hispanic cooking classes, sunken pirate ships and more. \*Of the 200 grants given, only 3 went to Indiana libraries. RPL was one of them! American libraries are incubators for the humanities. Every day, libraries engage people in reading and discussing literature; host authors and speakers; lead important, and often challenging, conversations that stretch their patrons' understanding of the world around them; and record and archive their communities' stories through oral history collections and digitization projects.

With funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, the American Library Association (ALA) distributed \$2 million in American Rescue Plan (ARP) funding to help anchor libraries as strong humanities institutions as they emerge and rebuild from the coronavirus pandemic. The purpose of this emergency relief program is to assist libraries that have been adversely affected by the pandemic and require support to restore and sustain their core activities.

ALA distributed up to 200 ARP grants of \$10,000 each to libraries, with an emphasis on reaching libraries in historically underserved and/or rural communities. Libraries will be selected through a competitive, peer-reviewed application process.

#### Sign up starts Monday, May 23.



May 4, 10 am—Gift From the Sea by Anne Morrow Lindbergh

While on vacation on Florida's Captiva Island in the early 1950's, Lindbergh wrote the essay-style work by taking shells on the beach for inspiration and reflecting on the lives of Americans, particularly American women, in the mid-20th century. She shares her meditations on youth and age, love and marriage, peace, solitude, and contentment during her visit.

"This is a book about Heaven," says Jayber Crow, "but I must say too that... I have wondered sometimes if it would not finally turn out to be a book about Hell."
